This letter is to comply with chapter one, section 12, of the Federal Property and Equipment Manual to request DoD weapons that are considered excess or surplus property.

SECTION TWO

- a. This department understands and agrees to the terms and conditions applicable to weapon transfers and detailed in the Memorandum of Agreement between the Defense Logistics Agency and the governor appointed State Coordinator Ohio Department of Public Safety 1033 Program.
- b. The care and maintenance of the weapons will be financed and supplied by a combination of monies that have been obtained through drug related forfeitures (seizures, mandatory fines, etc.) The requested weapons when not in use will be stored in the departmental firearms safe. This department also utilizes one officer who is state certified in firearms training and functions as the department armorer.
- c. The Police Department and the Chief of Police understands the BATF regulations governing the registration of the requested weapons and will comply with the same.

This department has recently formed a High Risk Arrest and Warrant Team for use in conducting search warrants and arrests of individuals which, by nature of their offenses, or location, pose a greater risk of danger than normally encountered by regular patrol officers. This Team is also for perimeter containment on tactical scenes until our multi-agency SWAT team can deploy. Additionally, our High Risk Arrest and Warrant Team participates with officers from adjoining agencies in performing similar duties in their jurisdiction as well to avoid duplication of effort and equipment expense for agencies.

When the weapons listed above are awarded, the rifles will be issued to select members of the ██████████ Police Department High Risk and Warrant Team, and the pistols will be used as the primary sidearm weapon for the High Risk Arrest and Warrant Team. Each member (officer) will be trained in the weapons use, care and maintenance and be required to qualify according to the guidelines promulgated by the Ohio Peace Officers Training (OPOTA) standards. Our department currently has four firearm instructors who are OPOTA certified. Three (3) pistols and one (1) rifle will be kept as spares and ready replacements.

The use of the weapons will vary each year depending upon the individual situation(s) and circumstances. These weapons will be used for the arrest team training, the Quick Action Deployment Team (QUAD) training and during general firearms training. Additionally, these weapons will be used anytime a situation develops in which deployment of the arrest team would be needed.
